Top news of the month

It is simply the greatest discovery in the history of paleontology! The "Tanis Site" located in North Dakota was discover in 2013 by Robert Depalma, PBMNH Curator of Paleontology (now emeritus). This is a flood deposit formed 30 to 90 minutes following the asteroid strike at the end of the Cretaceous Period. The story of this discovery and Robert's latest findings there are the subject of a new two-part Nova special "Dinosaur Apocalypse" now available on PBS and narrated by David Attenborough.

This last exhibit will feature the contributions of women archaeologists to our knowledge of Florida's past. Included are exquisite and rare wooden carvings from Broward County's "Margate-Blount Site" located in Parkland. This site, first excavated by archaeologist Wilma Williams in 1959. laid the aroundwork for the establishment of the Broward County Archaeological Society, the "grand-father" of our current museum.
